# Do You Know Our National And State Organization?

The General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) is an international women's organization dedicated to community improvement by enhancing the lives of others through volunteer service. GFWC's roots can be traced back to 1868 when Jane Cunningham Croly (1829-1901), a professional New York journalist, attempted to attend a dinner at an allmale press club honoring British novelist Charles Dickens. Croly was denied admittance based upon her gender, and, in response, she formed a club for women. In 1890 she extended an invitation to women's clubs throughout the U.S. to attend a ratification convention in New York City. 63 clubs attended on April 23-25 and took action to form the General Federation of Women's Clubs. Membership now exists in all 50 states and more than a dozen countries. GFWC clubwomen are a very diverse group dedicated to working together to enhance the lives of others through volunteer service.

The GFWC of Massachusetts was founded in 1893, and, jointly with GFWC was instrumental in the following accomplishments.

- Establishing more than 75% of the nation's libraries.
- In 1945, one of 5 women's organizations chosen to participate in the conference to form the United Nations.
- In 1961, held a Women's Crusade for Seat Belts program resulting in the installation of more than one million seat belts of the course of one year.
- In Massachusetts, in the two year period of 2000-2002, clubwomen worked 1,745,708 volunteer hours and gave \$1,732,721 to community service with \$333,047 in club and state scholarships.

The advantage of membership in both the national and local GFWC organizations is to increase the voices of clubwomen in order to make accomplishments such as those above possible. The advantages to our club are the resources and support we can receive for our own local interests.
